James A. Smith Jr., DMD

Dr. Smith received his dental degree in 1980 from the University of Alabama School of Dentistry and completed his endodontic residency there in 1982. He has been in private endodontic practice for almost 35 years and is an adjunct assistant professor with the Department of Endodontics at The University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Dentistry. Dr. Smith co-authored an article that was published in the 2015 Journal of Endodontics. His dental practice is located in Birmingham, Alabama.



Syngcuk Kim, DDS, PhD, MD

Dr. Kim earned his undergraduate and dental degrees from Columbia University in New York, as well as his PhD in circulatory physiology at Columbia's Medical School Physiology Department. He is the Louis I. Grossman Professor for the Department of Endodontics at the School of Dental Medicine, University of Pennsylvania, as well as Associate Dean for both Global Affairs and Advanced Dental Education for the School of Dental Medicine. Here Dr. Kim established the school's Microscope Training Center, the world's first university-based microscope training program teaching microendodontics and microsurgery. He is primary author of Color Atlas of Microsurgery in Endodontics.

Practicing endodontists are faced daily with the challenges of the root canal system anatomy and the need to disinfect and debride complex systems that stretch beyond what we are able to visualize. Achieving a goal of maximizing disinfection and debridement with minimal shaping and dentin removal has amplified challenges. Over time, the evolution of tools and technologies aid in this cause, from passive to active irrigation methods; however, it is now time to embrace the paradigm shift in active RCS disinfection and the preservation of more natural tooth structure. In this course, Dr. Smith introduces attendees to the GentleWave procedure, and offers the opportunity to utilize this system hands-on.

Modern endodontic microsurgery is fundamentally different from old apical surgery or apicoectomy in terms of instruments, materials, biological principles, and success rate. In this course, Dr. Kim presents "Indications for Microsurgery" and illustrations of 8 steps in microsurgery — esthetic flap management, effective homeostasis, a small osteotomy, skillful management of mental nerve and sinus, identification of complex root canal anatomy visible on the resected root surface, precise root-end preparation with ultrasonic tips, root-end filling with MTA or Bioceramic, and flap closure with microsutures. Long term outcome is also presented.

Take a break, earn 1 CE hour, and enjoy a delicious boxed lunch! Dr. Limosani compares and contrasts the traditional approach to modern methods of access and instrumentation, keeping in mind the hierarchy of tooth needs. Attendees develop an appreciation for the evolution of access design in anteriors, premolars, and molars and a determination of measures to preserve dentin where it matters within the root canal system. Dr. Limosani summarizes technology to treat the root canal system more conservatively, yet thoroughly.

1 - Advancement of nonsurgical endo from stainless steel K-files, vertical warm GP tech vs. lateral condensation tech, and NiTi rotary file systems has been significant and profound. There is still a struggle with 3D cleaning of curved/irregular canals, as studies show close to 30% of necrotic pulp tissues can remain. Can the canal be cleaned the 3D way without removing too much dental structure? Dr. Kim illustrates for participants a canal sealer based single GP cone technique after 3D shaping the canal using a newly developed XP-Shaper and Finisher system.

2 - Original indications for dental implants included the replacement of single missing teeth in partially and completely edentulous situations. Now, some clinicians suggest the extraction of teeth that could be saved by root canal therapy and prosthetic reconstruction, as implant treatment is believed to be more predictable. But is it? The dilemma for many clinicians is when to treat a tooth endodontically and save it, or extract and place an implant. Dr. Kim discusses nonsurgical and surgical treatments and true success/survival rates of implants. Attendees are able to compare endodontic and implant studies according to success/survival rates, understand the importance of an interdisciplinary treatment planning approach, and make educated decisions regarding whether to endodontically treat a tooth or extract and place an implant.

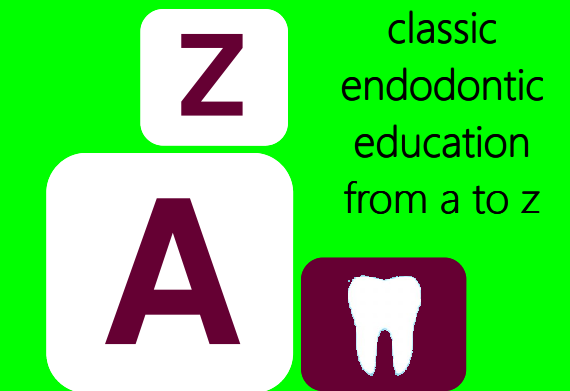
